

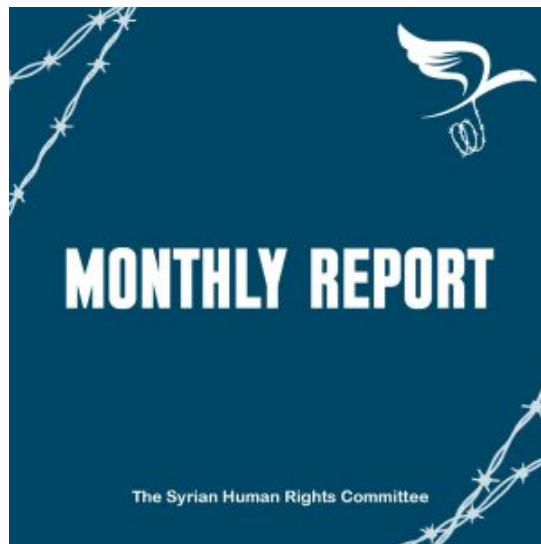

Semi-Annual Report on the Number of Human Rights Violation Victims in Syria

The Syrian Human Rights Committee (SHRC) documented the killing of 442 civilians in Syria during the first half of 2024 (from January 1 to June 30). Among these were 61 children, 28 women, and 17 people who were killed under torture.

The Assad regime was responsible for the deaths of 65 civilians, the Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) for 41 civilians, opposition factions for 12 civilians, ISIS for 6 people, the Israeli occupation forces for 8 people, the Jordanian forces for 14 people while countering drug smuggling, and the Turkish border guards for one person.

SHRC also documented the assassination of 176 people by unknown assailants, 47 people killed by the explosion of explosive devices and remnants of shelling, and 57 people killed by landmine explosions.

Daraa province had the highest number of victims, with 127 people, followed by Deir ez-Zor province with 115 people, and then Aleppo province with 61 people.

The total number of victims in Raqqa province was 35, followed by Homs province with 27, then As-Suwayda province with 20, Al-Hasakah province with 18, and Idlib province with 17.

Hama province had 9 victims, followed by both Latakia and Rif Dimashq (Rural Damascus) with 3 victims each, and the capital, Damascus, ranked last with only 3 victims.
