WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 530,400 last week to 538,700 this week.

In Bago Region (East), ongoing conflict and aerial attacks forced 425 IDPs from Kyaukkyi Township and 1,200 IDPs from Htantabin Township to flee within the same Township.

In Kayah State, 273 IDPs from Bawlake Township were displaced to Demoso Township due to increased fighting and shelling. In Kayin State, as a result of armed clashes, 153 IDPs from Kyainseikgyi Township were displaced within the Township.

In Tanintharyi Region, 1,935 IDPs from Dawei Township, 4,320 IDPs from Palaw Township, and 50 IDPs from Kyaunsu Township were displaced within their Townships due to indiscriminate shelling and the use of heavy weapons.

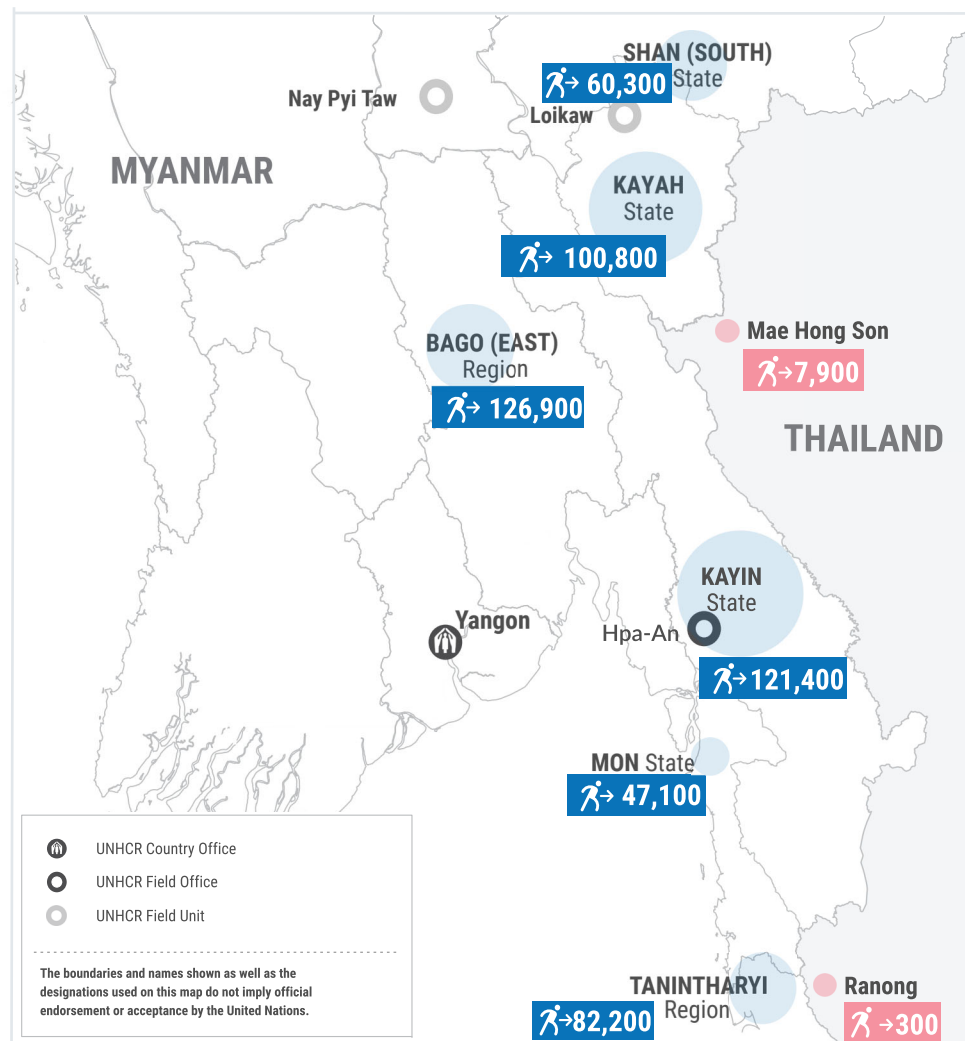
Across the border, about 8,300 people from Myanmar remain displaced in Mae Hong Son Province and Ranong, Thailand.

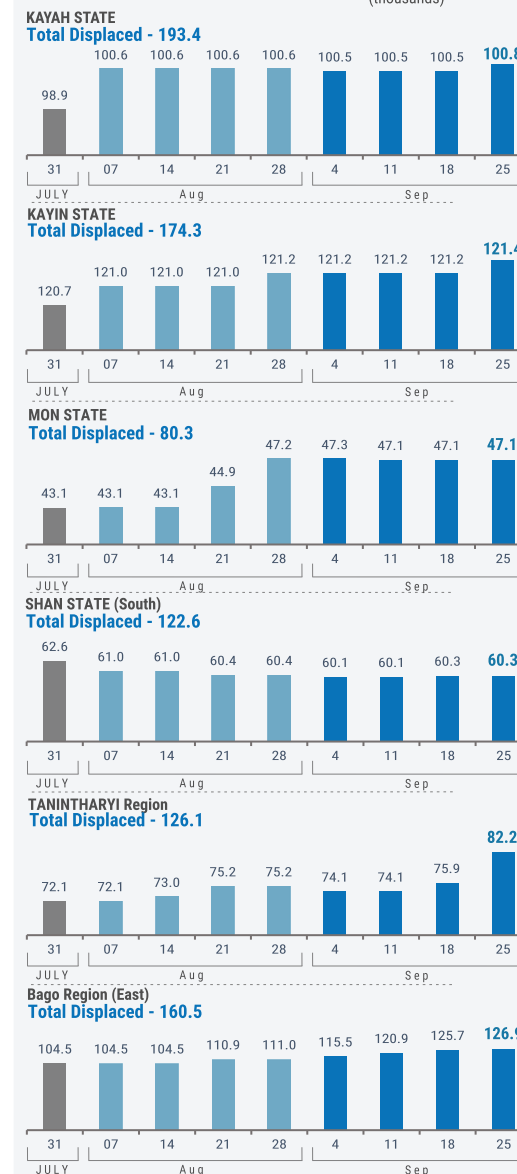

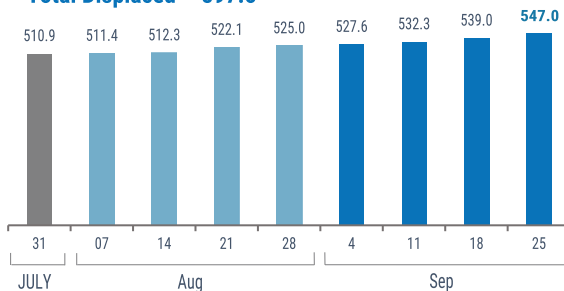
