WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) has slightly increased from 684,400 last week to 690,300 this week.

In Kayah State, 175 IDPs from Loikaw Township were displaced within the same Township due to the indiscriminate shelling.

In Kayin State, 366 IDPs from Kawkareik Township were displaced to both Hpa-An Township and, within the same Township, Kawkareik, due to increased fighting.

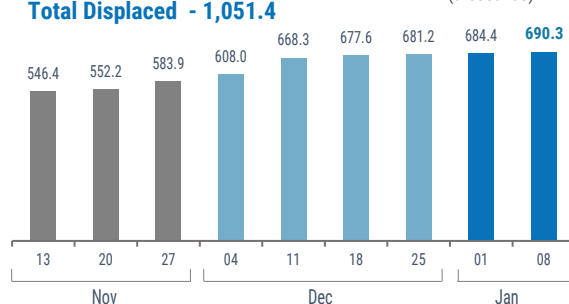
In Shan State (South), due to intense fighting including airstrikes, 461 IDPs from Pekon Township were displaced to Pinlaung and Taunggyi townships. Additionally, 4,915 IDPs from Loikaw Township were relocated to Shan State (South); 3,041 to Hsihseng, 1,232 to Nyaungshwe, 368 to Kalaw, 120 to Hopong, 119 to Taunggyi and 35 to Lawksawk Townships, respectively. Among them, 42 IDPs from Demoso Township, Kayah State, experienced a secondary displacement due to the volatile situation within Loilem Township.

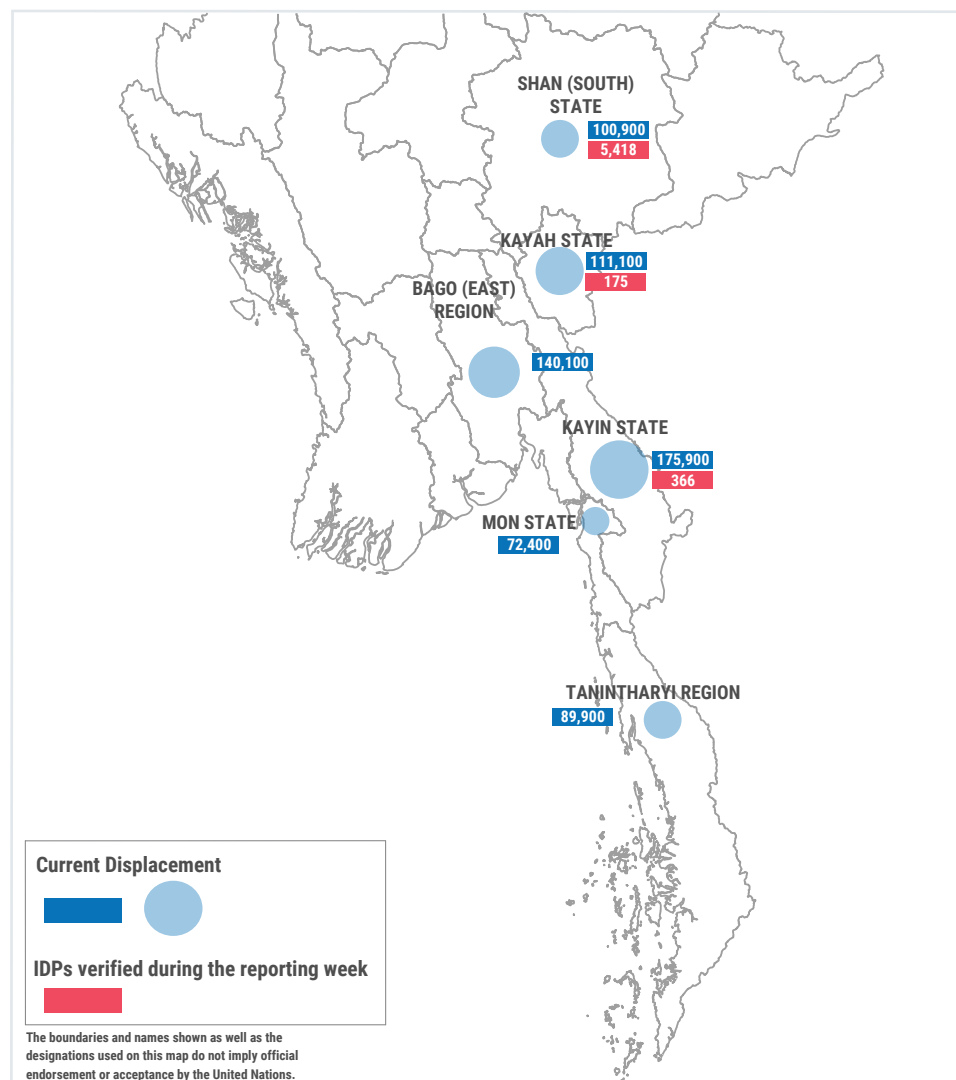
