WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) slightly decreased from 972,300 last week to 972,200 this week.

In Bago, the fighting between the Tatmadaw and Ethnic Armed Organizations (EAOs) displaced 362 people within the same township. Indiscriminate shelling forced over 140 people to flee in Kayin State's Thandaunggyi and Kawkareik Townships.

In Kayah State, 623 IDPs from Loikaw Township fled on a secondary displacement to Loikaw and Demoso Townships as a result of the ongoing conflicts.

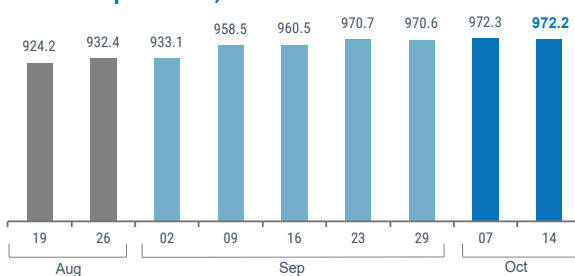
On the other hand, 200 displaced persons returned from Nyaungshwe Township, in Shan State (South), to Loikaw Town. Similarly, 254 and 217 IDPs returned to their places of origin in Lashio Township, in Shan State (North), coming from Kyethi and Laihka Townships, located in the southern part of the state.

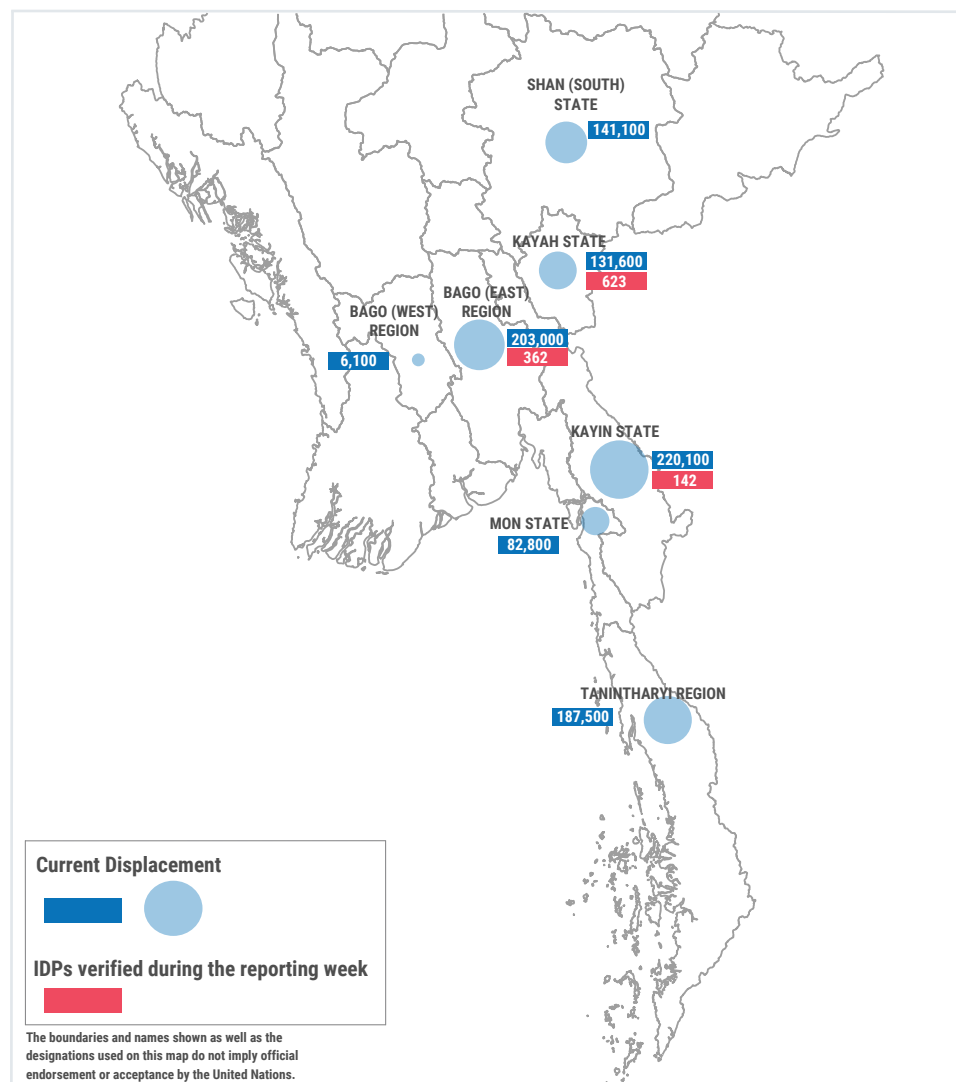
