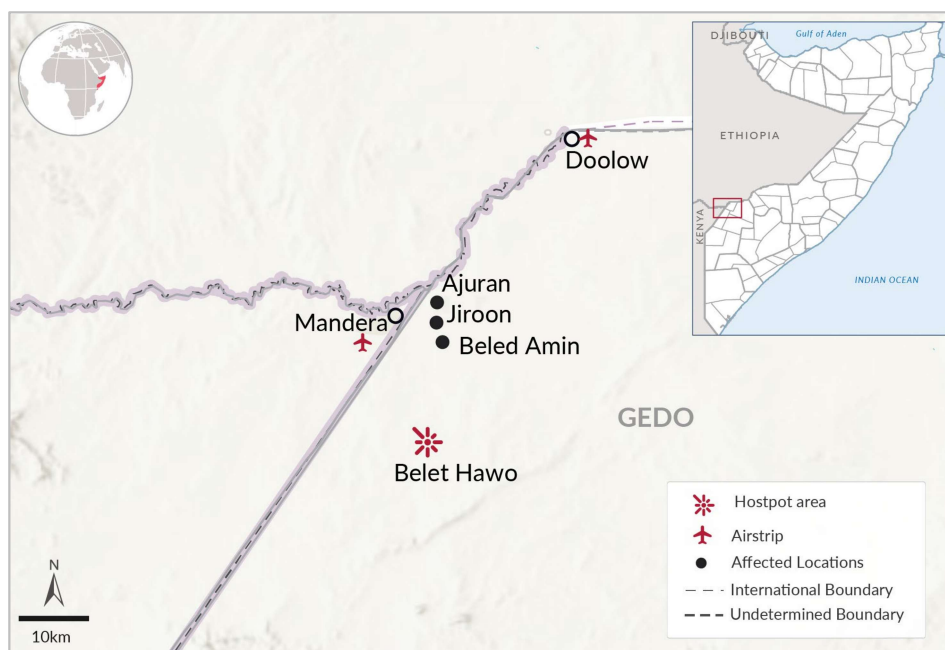

Background

On 11 August 2025, armed clashes erupted in Belet-Hawo, Gedo Region, between two armed groups affiliated with the Federal Government of Somalia and the Jubaland State. The incident was triggered when an armed group associated with Jubaland, previously relocated from Belet-Hawo to Mandera (Kenya), returned and established a base near the Tool-Amiin IDP site. Their presence heightened tensions in an already militarized area occupied by Federal forces, creating fear among the local and displaced populations.

In the early morning, fighting broke out between the two groups, leading to the new displacement of 2,530 households (15,180 individuals) to surrounding areas including Liilan, Idaan, Gaawido, Hodan and Oda. The displaced communities are currently without adequate shelter. Reports indicate that two civilians were injured as a result of the crossfire.

This marks the third wave of armed clashes in Belet-Hawo since July 2025, intensifying the scale of forced displacement and heightening protection risks. Those most affected include already vulnerable groups such as children, women, older persons, and persons with disabilities.

Protection Risks

Attacks on Civilians and Civilian Objects: Civilian casualties have been documented, and the volatile situation presents a high risk of further attacks on civilians and unlawful killings. Civilian infrastructure and IDP settlements remain exposed to potential damage as the conflict persists.

Forced Displacement: Over 15,000 individuals have been forcibly displaced in the third wave of clashes, with many experiencing secondary displacement that further exacerbates their vulnerability.

Gender-Based Violence: Women and girls face heightened risks of GBV, including sexual assault and domestic violence, due to overcrowded living conditions, lack of safe shelter, and insecurity.

Urgent Humanitarian Needs

Emergency Shelter and NFIs: Newly displaced families are sheltering in overcrowded sites alongside already displaced populations, living in makeshift shelters with limited privacy. There is an urgent need for emergency shelter materials and non-food items to restore minimum living conditions and preserve the affected population's health, safety and dignity.

Food Assistance: Many displaced households were already food insecure prior to this displacement. The influx of newly displaced from Tool-Amiin and Camp Ajuuran has worsened the food security situation.

Water: Many have been displaced have settled in locations where water trucking is underway. This has increased the number of households relying on this service and reduced the available water supply per household.

Protection services: Psychosocial support and counselling services are urgently required, including cash assistance to enable displaced households to address immediate needs, mitigate protection risks, and prevent negative coping mechanisms.

The Protection & Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN) is a UNHCR-led project that identifies and reports on displacements, as well as the protection risks and incidents driving such population movements. On behalf of UNHCR and the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), 10 local partners across Somalia conduct data gathering—primarily through interviews with affected communities and key informants—and monitor displacement trends at strategic locations.
