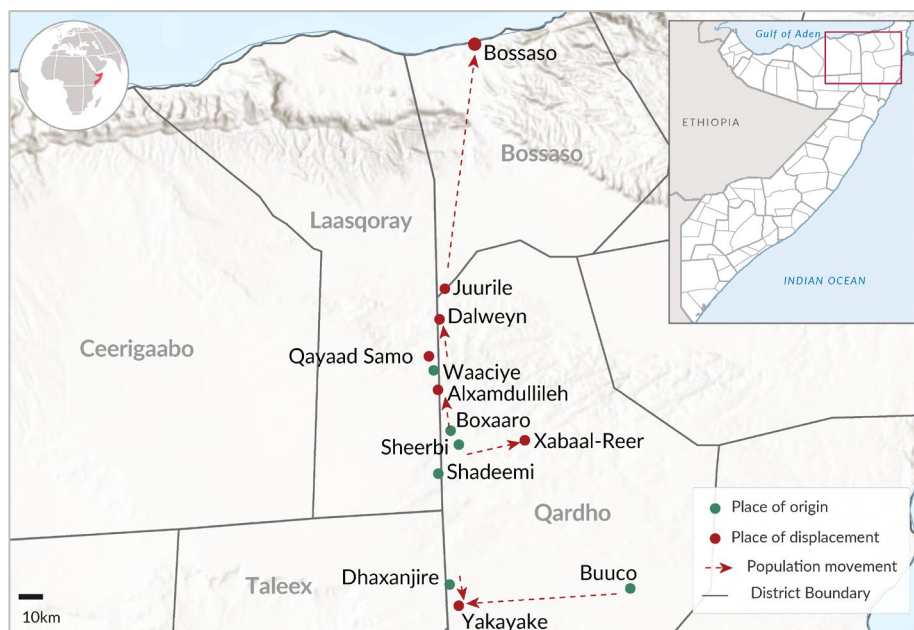

## Background

Communities in Qardho District in Bari Region are among the hardest hit by the prolonged drought affecting Puntland. The Protection and Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN) has recorded the displacement of approximately 919 households (around 5,514 individuals) from Qardho District and neighbouring villages as drought conditions continue to deteriorate. Pastoralist families have been forced to move in search of water and pasture, relocating toward the Ceeriye and Walale valleys in Karkaar Region within Qardho District, to Bosaso District, and to remote areas of Sanaag Region, particularly the rural zones of Yubbe and Ceergaabo. Some households have also crossed into Ethiopia's Somali Regional State.

Because of the mountainous terrain and long distances travelled, displaced families face heightened risks of family separation—particularly affecting children, older persons, and individuals with disabilities. The arrival of newly displaced households is adding further pressure to already overstretched displacement sites and host communities. In the affected areas, primary water sources have largely dried up. As a result, communities must travel long distances to Qardho and Dhuure Juurile to access water, exposing them to additional protection risks. Reduced funding has also forced several humanitarian partners to scale down activities in IDP-hosting locations. Cash assistance has been suspended since October, and in-kind support remains very limited. The absence of specialized protection services has further increased protection risks within communities, leaving people more susceptible to violence, abuse, and exploitation.

## Protection Risks

**Forced Displacement:** Prolonged drought has forced rural communities to leave their areas of origin in search of water and pasture for both households and livestock.

**Risk of Mines and Explosive Ordnance:** Some areas of origin and displacement routes include locations recently liberated from ISIS, where the local reports of presence of mines and explosive remnants of war remain a concern.

**Psychological and Emotional Distress:** The loss of livestock, often the primary source of food and income combined with long-distance movement in search of food, water and protection has resulted in significant psychological and emotional distress, as well as physical exhaustion among affected populations.

## Urgent Humanitarian Needs

 **Safe Water Supply:** Access to safe water is the most urgent need due to the failure of the expected rainy season and the drying up of water sources.

 **Food Assistance:** Affected households primarily depend on livestock and small-scale farming, both of which have collapsed as a result of water scarcity. Immediate food assistance - through unconditional cash transfers or in-kind for remote communities is critically required.

 **Protection Services:** Displaced populations are facing multiple protection risks, including family separation, exposure to gender-based violence and psychological distress. These risks are more pronounced in hard-to-reach and inaccessible areas, where limited partner capacity hinders effective and timely monitoring of protection concerns, violations, and responses. Individual Protection Assistance (IPA), establishment of mobile protection desks for case management and referrals, and provision of psychosocial support services are urgently needed.



The Protection & Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN) is a UNHCR-led project that identifies and reports on displacements, as well as the protection risks and incidents driving such population movements. On behalf of UNHCR and the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), 10 local partners across Somalia conduct data gathering—primarily through interviews with affected communities and key informants—and monitor displacement trends at strategic locations.
