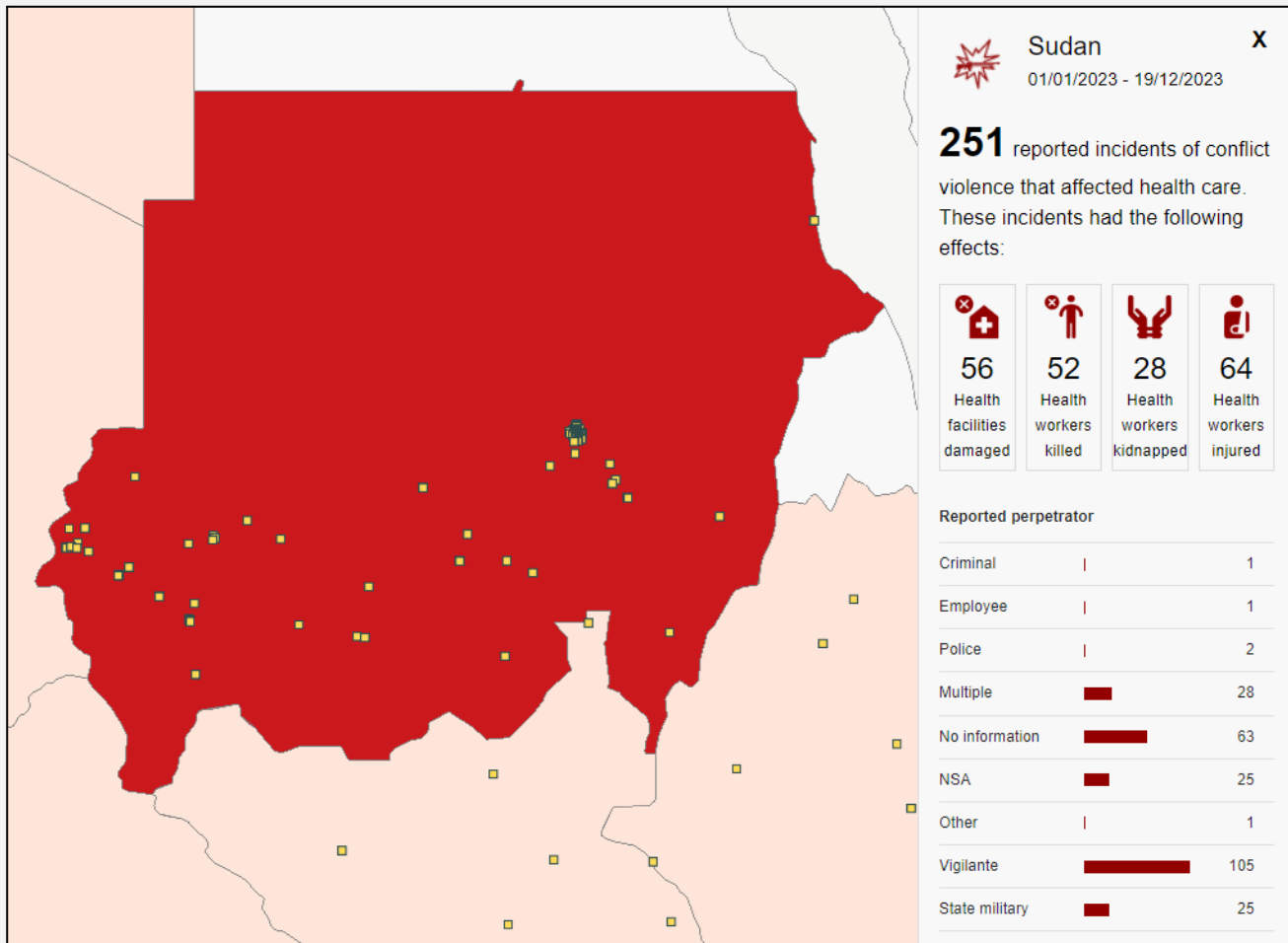

Attacks on Health Care in Sudan

27 December 2023-09 January 2024



Insecurity Insight has identified at least 251 attacks on Sudan's health care system between 01 January-19 December 2023. In these incidents, 52 health workers have been killed and health facilities have been damaged 56 times. These attacks undermine health care providers' ability to effectively meet patient needs, maintain safe staffing levels and impact the population's access to health care. Documented incidents

30 December 2023: In Al Manaqil, Al Jazirah State, a male doctor was shot and killed by the RSF as they unloaded a bus and shot at the passengers. His body was thrown next to a canal.

30 December 2023: In Omdurman, Khartoum State, snipers were stationed on the roof of Alia Military Hospital. **Source:** [Sudan Post](#)

As reported on 03 January 2024: In Al Hasahisa, Al Jazirah State, the Obstetrics and Gynecology Hospital was looted and burnt down by the RSF. **Source:** [Personal Communication](#)

Around 23 December 2023: In Wad Medani city, Al Jazirah state, a doctor was reportedly shot and killed by the RSF who accused him of being SAF military intelligence. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

24 December 2023: In Buram market, Buram locality, Central Darfur state, the director of Buram Hospital was shot and killed in front of his private clinic. **Source:** [Personal Communication](#)

Around 01 January 2024: In Kamlin district, Al Jazirah state, the RSF looted and occupied Al Kamlin Hospital. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹

Around 01 January 2024: In Wad Medani city, Al Jazirah state, the RSF looted a medical laboratory. **Source:** [ACLED](#)¹
