Monthly Report for August on Human Rights Violations in Syria

The Syrian Human Rights Committee (SHRC) documented the killing of (73) individuals in Syria during the month of August 2023. Among them were (20) children, (3) women, and (7) individuals who died under torture.

The Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) were responsible for the deaths of (22) individuals, while government forces were responsible for the deaths of (15) individuals. Russian airstrikes were responsible for the deaths of (5) people, opposition factions were responsible for the deaths of (3) individuals, and the Turkish border guards (Gendarmerie) were responsible for the death of one person.

SHRC also documented the assassination of (13) individuals by unknown assailants and (7) individuals killed in explosions from explosive devices and shelling remnants. Additionally, (5) people were documented to have died due to landmine explosions, and one person – a newborn baby – died due to a lack of healthcare in the Rukban camp on the Syrian-Jordanian border.

Deir ez-Zor province had the highest number of casualties among all provinces, with (27) individuals killed, followed by Aleppo province with (12) individuals. Idlib and Daraa provinces each had (11) casualties.

The total number of casualties in Hama and Raqqa provinces was (3) individuals each, (2) in both Homs and Hasakah provinces, and (1) in both Latakia and Suwayda provinces.
