1. Key points

- As of 1 January 2024, the total number of UNRWA colleagues killed since the beginning of hostilities is **142.**
- Since 7 October 2023, up to 1.9 million people (or over 85 per cent of the population) have been displaced across the Gaza Strip, some multiple times. Families are forced to move repeatedly in search of safety. Information on internally displaced numbers for northern Gaza and Gaza City was last updated on 12 October due to access constraints and the security situation.
- As of 30 December 2023, nearly 1.4 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) are sheltering in 155 UNRWA facilities across all five governorates of the Gaza Strip, including 160,000 in the north and Gaza City and approximately 400,000 in close vicinity of these installations and receiving assistance from UNRWA. A total of 1.79 million¹ IDPs are receiving assistance from UNRWA.

1 This includes nearly 160,000 IDPs in north Gaza and Gaza City governorates as of 12 October. UNRWA's ability to provide humanitarian support and update data in the above areas is severely restricted. The hostilities, Israeli Forces' evacuation orders and the constant search for safer places meant that people are displaced multiple times. UNRWA shelters often provide assistance to registered Palestine Refugees and other members of the community. There are instances where total numbers could be duplicated due to overlapping registrations, this is why we use "estimates" for these figures.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- Israeli Security Forces (ISF) conducted a search and arrest operation in Jit Junction, Northern West Bank on 31 December 2023.
- On 31 December, ISF shot, injured and detained a Palestinian at the entrance of the Mishor Adumim settlement, central West Bank.
- Early in the morning on 1 January in Qatanneh, central West Bank, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation that resulted in the detention of 13 Palestinians.
- On 1 January, a 23-year-old Palestinian prisoner from Nablus died in Megiddo Israeli prison. His death is the seventh recroded since 7 October reported among Palestinian prisoners in Israeli detention, according to the Palestinian Prisoners' Authority and the Prisoners' Club.
- On 1 January in Umm Rukba, southern West Bank, ISF allegedly took over a Palestinian home and used the roof as an observation post and to fire tear gas canisters and stun grenades toward Palestinians.

2. Overall situation

The Gaza Strip

• On 1 January, according to the Ministry of Health in Gaza, at least 21,978 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 57,697 Palestinians have been reportedly injured since.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

We were unable to gather updated figures for the death toll in West Bank, including East Jerusalem.

- According to OCHA, between 7 October–30 December, 307 Palestinians, including 79 children, have been killed in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem.
- 2023 was the deadliest year for Palestinians in the West Bank since the UN began recording casualties in 2005.

3. Humanitarian access & protection of civilians

- UNRWA is working to verify details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further information will be provided once it becomes available.
 - On 29 December, a number of incidents were reported in two separate schools in the Middle Area,
 where one Internally Displaced Person (IDP) sheltering in a school was injured by a stray bullet;
 and an additional IDP sheltering at a different school was reportedly killed by an ISF tank shell
 when he attempted to leave the school, one UNRWA staff was injured.

- On the same day, two different incidents were reported in UNRWA shelters and its premises in Khan Younis, one **IDP** (child) sheltering was injured by a stray bullet that directly fell inside an IDP tent and other stray bullet directly impacted another tent.
- On 31 December, **15 IDPs** and one **UNRWA staff**, sheltering in a school in Khan Younis were injured as a result of the school being directly struck. On the same day, two **stray** bullets directly struck a different school. No injuries were reported.
- 212 incidents impacting UNRWA premises and the people inside them have been reported since 7
 October (some with multiple incidents impacting the same location), including at least 21 incidents of
 military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. This includes 60 direct hits on UNRWA installations
 and 68 different UNRWA installations sustaining collateral damage.
- In total at least **315** IDPs sheltering in UNRWA shelters have been killed and at least another **1,148** were injured since 7 October.

4. UNRWA response

The Gaza Strip

UNRWA Shelters

- As of 30 December in total, nearly 1.4 million displaced people are now sheltering in 155 UNRWA installations, with another 400,000 registered and accessing services from UNRWA.
- The average number of IDPs in UNRWA shelters in the middle and southern areas is over 12,000. This
 is more than four times their capacity.

Health

- On 31 December eight (out of 22) UNRWA health centres are still operational in the middle and southern areas recorded 8,952² patient visits.
- Midwives are providing care for post-natal and high-risk pregnant women at the eight operational health centres. On 31 December, a total of 219³ post-natal and high-risk pregnancy cases were attended to at health centres.
- On 31 December, UNRWA continued to provide health care at UNRWA health centres and shelters with 654 staff maintaining health services.
- On 31 December, UNRWA attended to 21,062 patients in UNRWA shelters and health centres.

Psychosocial support (PSS)

UNRWA teams, including 284 social workers in the shelters, continue to provide psychosocial first aid
and other specialized protection services to IDPs. As of 30 December, around 80,343 IDPs were
reached.

- Between 30 and 31 December, school counsellors addressed 1,511 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis, alongside 1,149 group sessions. These efforts reached 21,450 IDPs, contributing to an accumulative total of 57,460 PSS sessions provided since 7 October.
- During the same period, school counselors provided psychological support to nearly 400 UNRWA staff, through both in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA staff provided with psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is 5,399.

Food security

• UNRWA continued to **distribute flour** outside of shelters in the southern governorates. **A total of 181,805 families have been reached so far.**

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

- Between 31 December 2023 and 1 January 2024, water wells in Jabalia, Khan Younis and Rafah were operational. Approximately 13,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply service.
- During the same period, the solid waste management service continued at Rafah, Khan Younis and middle area camps. About 120 loadings have been transferred to temporary dumping sites.

- Since 7 October 2023, up to 1.9 million people (or over 85 per cent of the population) have been displaced across the Gaza Strip, some multiple times. Families are forced to move repeatedly in search of safety. Information on internally displaced numbers for northern Gaza and Gaza City was last updated on 12 October due to access constraints and the security situation.
- As of 2 January 2023, nearly 1.4 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) are sheltering in 155 UNRWA facilities across all five governorates of the Gaza Strip, including 160,000 in the north and Gaza City, and approximately 500,000 are in close vicinity of these installations and

receiving assistance from UNRWA. A total of 1.88 million¹ IDPs are receiving assistance from UNRWA.

1 This includes nearly 160,000 IDPs in north Gaza and Gaza City governorates as of 12 October. UNRWA's ability to provide humanitarian support and update data in the above areas is severely restricted. The hostilities, Israeli Forces' evacuation orders and the constant search for safer places meant that people are displaced multiple times. There are instances where total numbers could be duplicated due to overlapping registrations, this is why we use "estimates" for these figures.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- On 2 January, Israeli Security Forces (ISF) operation took place in Qalqilya in the northwest of the West Bank. There are reports of an exchange of fire with unconfirmed reports of fatalities.
- On 3 January, ISF started an operation in Tulkarm and Nur Shams refugee camps, in the north wester of the West Bank. The ISF operation has reportedly damaged public and private infrastructure and resulted in the arrest of hundreds of individuals.
- On 3 January a general strike was observed across the West Bank main cities after the killing of Hamas leader Saleh al Arouri in Beirut on 2 January.

2. Overall situation

The Gaza Strip

• According to the Ministry of Health in Gaza on 3 January, at least 22,313 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 57,296 Palestinians have been reportedly injured.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- According to OCHA, between 7 October 2023–3 January 2024, 313 Palestinians, including 80 children, have been killed in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem. ISF have injured 3,949 Palestinians, including 593 children; 52 percent in the context of search and arrest and other operations.
- Last year (2023) was the deadliest year for Palestinians in the West Bank since the UN began recording casualties in 2005.

3. Humanitarian access & protection of civilians

The Gaza Strip

• UNRWA is working to verify details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further information will be provided once it becomes available.

- On 1 January 2024, in Khan Younis (in the south), one internally Dispalced Person (IDP)
 was killed and another was injured as a result of a reported drone strike while the IDPs
 were transferring water between two schools within close proximity of each other; in
 a different incident another school in Khan Younis sustained damage as result of a
 stray bullet that directly struck a window.
- On 2 January, an IDP sheltering in a school in Khan Younis was injured in front of the main gate, as a result of nearby strike, which also caused shrapnel to fall inside the school.
 - On 3 January 2024, four IDPs sheltering in a school in the Middle Areas were killed and five were injured, as a result of a direct strike on a building (school attendant's house) inside the school premises.
- 217 incidents impacting UNRWA premises and people inside them have been reported since
 7 October (some with multiple incidents impacting the same location), including at least
 22 incidents of military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. This includes 62 direct
 hits on UNRWA installations and 69 different UNRWA installations sustaining collateral
 damage.
- In total, at least 319 IDPs sheltering in UNRWA shelters have been killed and at least another 1,135² were injured since 7 October.

4. UNRWA response

The Gaza Strip

UNRWA Shelters

- As of 2 January, in total, nearly 1.4 million displaced people are now sheltering in 155 UNRWA installations, with another half a million (or 500,000) registered and accessing services from UNRWA.
- The average number of IDPs in UNRWA shelters in the middle and southern areas is over 12,000. This is more than four times their capacity.

Health

- On 2 January 2024, eight (out of 22) UNRWA health centres are still operational in the middle and southern areas and recorded 10,657 patient visits.
- Midwives are providing care for post-natal and high-risk pregnant women at the eight operational health centres. On 31 December, a total of 209³ post-natal and high-risk pregnancy cases were attended to at health centres.
- On 2 January, UNRWA continued to provide health care at UNRWA health centres and shelters with 634 staff maintaining health services.

• On 2 January, UNRWA attended to 20,643 patients in UNRWA shelters and health centres.

3 Results for post-natal cases were only from 7 of the 8 operational health centres

Psychosocial support (PSS)

- UNRWA teams, including 284 social workers in the shelters, continue to provide psychosocial first aid and other specialized protection services to IDPs. As of 2 January, around 81,049 IDPs were reached.
- Between 1 and 2 January 2024, school counsellors addressed 1,102 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis, alongside 1,098 group sessions. These efforts reached 21,416 IDPs, contributing to an accumulative total of 59,660 PSS sessions provided since 7 October.
- During the same period, school counsellors provided psychological support to nearly 400 UNRWA staff, through both in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA staff provided with psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is 5,799.

Food security

• UNRWA continued to distribute flour outside of shelters in the southern governorates. A total of 188,851 families have been reached so far.

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

- Between 2–3 January 2024, water wells in Jabalia (north), Khan Younis and Rafah (south) were operational. Approximately 14,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply services.
- During the same period, the solid waste management service continued at Rafah, Khan Younis and middle area camps. About 100 loadings have been transferred to temporary dumping sites.

Families are forced to move repeatedly in search of safety. Information on the number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) in northern Gaza and Gaza City was last updated on 12 October due to access constraints and the security situation.
- As of 2 January, nearly 1.4 million IDPs are sheltering in 155 UNRWA facilities across all five governorates of the Gaza Strip, including 160,000 in the north and Gaza City, and

 According to the Ministry of Health in Gaza on 6 January, at least 22,835 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 58,416 Palestinians have been reportedly injured.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- According to OCHA, between 7 October 2023–5 January 2024, 315 Palestinians, including 81 children, have been killed in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem.
- Last year (2023) was the deadliest year for Palestinians in the West Bank including East Jerusalem since the UN began recording casualties in 2005.

3. Humanitarian access & protection of civilians

The Gaza Strip

- UNRWA is working to verify details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further information will be provided once it becomes available.
 - On January 4, an **UNRWA store in the Middle Area** was reportedly directly struck by ISF tanks shells, causing a fire in the building. Three UNRWA guards were present at the time of the strike
 - ISF forcefully evacuated 15 IDPs and five UNRWA staff sheltering in an UNRWA office in the Middle Area. Five UNRWA staff were detained, subsequently three were released and two remain detained.
 - In Khan Younis, on UNRWA premises one IDP child was injured as a result of shrapnel.
- 220 incidents impacting UNRWA premises and people inside them have been reported since
 7 October (some with multiple incidents impacting the same location), including at least
 23 incidents of military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. This includes 63 direct hits on UNRWA installations and 69 different UNRWA installations sustaining collateral damage.

UNRWA Shelters

- As of 2 January, in total, nearly 1.4 million displaced people are now sheltering in 155 UNRWA installations, with another half a million (or 500,000) accessing services from UNRWA.
- The average number of IDPs in UNRWA shelters in the middle and southern areas is over 12,000. This is more than four times their capacity.

Health

- On 4 January 2024, only five (out of 22) UNRWA health centres are still operational in the middle and southern areas with **7,639 patient visits recorded.**
- Midwives are providing care for post-natal and high-risk pregnant women at health centres.
 On 4 January a total of 130 post-natal and high-risk pregnancy cases were attended to at health centres.
- On 4 January, UNRWA continued to provide health care at UNRWA health centres and shelters with 570 staff maintaining health services.
- Between 4 to 5 January, UNRWA attended to 25,717 patients in UNRWA shelters and health centres.

Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) services were resumed in the Middle Area and Khan Younis with a team of two psychiatrists and 18 counsellors and supervisors to assist special cases referred from health centres and shelters. On 4 January, the team responded to 911 cases through individual consultations, awareness sessions, and support for gender-based violence cases.

Psychosocial support (PSS)

- UNRWA teams, including 284 social workers in the shelters, continue to provide psychosocial first aid and other specialized protection services to IDPs. As of 6 January, around 83,567 IDPs were reached.
- Between 3 4 January 2024, school counsellors addressed 1,064 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis, alongside 1,061 group sessions. These efforts

reached 20,957 IDPs, contributing to an accumulative total of 61,785 PSS sessions provided since 7 October.

 During the same period, school counsellors provided psychological support to nearly 404 UNRWA staff, through in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA staff provided with psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is 6,203.

Food security

 UNRWA continued to distribute flour outside of shelters in the southern governorates. A total of 219,460 families have been reached so far.

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

- Between 4–6 January 2024, water wells in Jabalia (north), Khan Younis and Rafah (south) were operational. Approximately 21,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply services.
- During the same period, the solid waste management services continued in Rafah, Khan Younis and middle area camps. About 120 loadings have been transferred to temporary dumping sites.

Quote from a young girl displaced in Rafah (south area) and sheltering in an UNRWA school:

"I look at the school yard and remember those moments I used to have with my friends during playtime... I never dreamt of sleeping in a school, or this beautiful place being turned into a shelter."

A total of 1.73 million¹ IDPs are receiving assistance from UNRWA. This number has reduced by approximately

150,000 as families were forced to move away from UNRWA facilities due to Israeli Authorities' issued evacuation orders in the middle area and Khan Younis (south).

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- On 8 January, Israeli Security Forces (ISF) conducted a search and arrest operation in Tulkarm, northern West Bank. Armed clashes took place in Tulkarm city, Tulkarm refugee camp and surrounding areas and three Palestinians were reportedly killed. ISF closed all entrances to the camp.
- Several ISF search and arrest operations leading to confrontations with Palestinians were reported across the West Bank, including operations in Nur Shams refugee camp, Qalqiliya Nablus, and other locations.
- On 7 January, the ISF search and arrest operation in Jenin city and Jenin refugee camp, northern West Bank, continued. On January 7, a Palestinian died from injuries sustained early in the morning. More than ten injuries were reported following an air strike in Jenin town's Al Shuhada square.

In a separate incident, four IDPs sheltering at a different school in Khan Younis were killed and six were injured, as a result of two reported strikes in close vicinity of the school premises.
- 222 incidents impacting UNRWA premises and the people inside them have been reported since

 at least 23 incidents of military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. 63 different

Psychosocial support (PSS)

- UNRWA teams, including 255 social workers in the shelters, continue to provide psychosocial first aid and other specialized protection services to IDPs. As of 6 January, around 83,576 IDPs were reached.
- School counsellors addressed 1,104 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis (south), alongside 1,032 group sessions. These efforts reached 20,957 IDPs, contributing to an accumulative total of 63,921 PSS sessions since 7 October.
- During the same period, school counsellors provided psychological support to nearly 427
 UNRWA staff, through in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA staff
 who have received psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is 6,630.

Food security

UNRWA continued to distribute flour outside of shelters in the southern governorates. A total
of 237,693 families have been reached so far.

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

- Between 7–8 January 2024, water wells in Jabalia (north), Khan Younis and Rafah (south) were operational. Nearly 14,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply services.
- During the same period, solid waste management services continued in Rafah, Khan Younis and the middle areas in Palestine refugee camps. The service has been forced to come to a halt in Bureij and Maghazi Palestine refugee camps due to the expansion of the Israeli Forces' operations. About 80 loadings have been transferred to temporary dumping sites.

- ISF conducted a search operation and opened fire during clashes with Palestinians in Ramallah, central West Bank. One Palestinian was injured with live ammunition and two Palestinians were detained. The injured Palestinian died the next day.

10 January:

- ISF opened fire during clashes with Palestinians in Abud, central West Bank. Three Palestinians were injured with live ammunition.
- ISF search and arrest operations were conducted in Nablus, Balata refugee camp and other locations across the West Bank.

- As of 12 January, in total, **nearly 1.4 million displaced people are now sheltering in 154 UNRWA installations**, with another500,000 approximately accessing services from UNRWA.

Health

- On 11 January 2024, only six (out of 22) UNRWA health centres were operational in the middle and southern areas with **9,875 patient visits recorded.**

 On 11 January, a total of 165 post-natal and high-risk pregnancy cases were attended to at the health centres.
- On 11 January, UNRWA continued to provide health care at UNRWA health centres and shelters with 690 staff maintaining health services.
- On 11 January, UNRWA attended to 20,952 patients in UNRWA shelters and health centres.
- Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) services were resumed in the middle area
 and Khan Younis (south) with a team of two psychiatrists and 20 counsellors and supervisors
 to assist special cases referred from health centres and shelters. On 11 January, the team
 responded to 1,962 cases through individual consultations, awareness sessions and support
 for gender-based violence cases.
- UNRWA received vaccines from UNICEF for its health centres. Eight different types of vaccines
 were received (refrigerated and freezer storage). This allowed for vaccination to restart. On 11
 January, a total of 768 children were vaccinated against diseases such as measles, mumps and
 rubella, and others.

Psychosocial support (PSS)

- School counsellors conducted 1,269 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis (south), alongside 1,099 group sessions. 23,988 IDPs were reached, with the cumulative total of 68,582 PSS sessions since 7 October.
- During the same period, school counsellors provided psychological support to nearly 477
 UNRWA staff, through in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA
 staff who have received psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is
 7,601.

Food security

• UNRWA continued to **distribute flour** outside of shelters in the southern governorates. **A total of 261,627 families have been reached so far.**

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

- During 11 January 2024, water wells in Jabalia (north), Khan Younis and Rafah (south) were operational. Nearly 5,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply services.
 - Provision of potable water through tankers at Rafah and Middle area ensured availability of water in shelters, with some interruption in the Middle Area due to evacuation orders. Khan Younis shelters are provided with water through an UNRWA water well.
 - Solid waste management services continued in Rafah, Khan Younis and Middle Area camps (partially). The service was suspended in Bureij camp due to the military operations. About 45 loadings were transferred to temporary dumping sites on January 11.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

West Bank updates are provided twice weekly and cover updates from 11 -15 January.

On January 11 and 12 the following Israeli Security Forces (ISF) search and arrest operations occurred:

- Continuation of search and arrest operations in Tulkarm city, Tulkarm camp and Nur Shams refugee
 camp, northern West Bank on 11 January. ISF closed all entrances to Nur Shams Camp, and snipers
 reportedly occupied the rooftops around the camp. Early in the morning on 12 January, ISF reportedly
 blocked the main streets of Tulkarm refugee camp with earth mounds. Severe destruction of
 infrastructure was reported in the city and camps.
- ISF reportedly opened fire in the vicinity of Adora settlement, near Idhna, southern West Bank. Three Palestinians, including two children, were killed. Overnight on 13 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in the houses of the three Palestinians killed. ISF reportedly assaulted their family members, detained several Palestinians and confiscated vehicles.

On 13 January the following ISF search and arrest operations occurred:

- ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Far'a Camp, northern West Bank. ISF vehicles reportedly surrounded the camp for several hours, entered multiple houses and buildings, and positioned snipers. An ISF bulldozer reportedly damaged infrastructure in the camp, including the wall opposite a health centre. Five people, including one minor, were injured during the exchange of fire. At least nine men were detained and released. ISF reportedly fired live ammunition towards an Al Jazeera journalist's vehicle. The operation ended in the late evening. UNRWA operations in the camp were severely affected.
- An exchange of fire took place between Palestinians and ISF in Jenin city and Jenin refugee camp, northern West Bank. ISF reportedly surrounded all hospitals in Jenin city and a military bulldozer destroyed infrastructure.

On 14 January the following ISF search and arrest operations occurred:

- ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Biddya, northern West Bank, and detained 15
 Palestinian labourers from Gaza.
- One Palestinian child was shot dead in clashes between Palestinians and ISF, during a search and arrest operation in Ein el -Sultan Camp, central West Bank.
- Palestinian chidlren were shot dead in clashes between Palestinians and ISF near Beit El/DCO checkpoint, north of Al Bireh city, central West Bank.

On 15 January the following ISF search and arrest operations occurred:

- An exchange of fire took place between ISF and Palestinians in the vicinity of Annab and Jbara checkpoints, south of Tulkarm, northern West Bank. One Palestinian Security Forces Officer was killed and another two were injured with live ammunition.
- ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Dura, southern West Bank. Two Palestinians, including
 a woman, were killed, and 10 Palestinians, including a journalist, were injured with live ammunition. A
 general strike was declared to mourn the deaths.

• Two Palestinians reportedly carried out a ramming attack and stabbed Israelis in Ra'anana city, Israel. One woman was killed and some 19 others were reported injured. ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in the city and detained two Palestinians.

2. Overall situation

 According to the Ministry of Health in Gaza as of 15 January, at least 24,100 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 60,834 Palestinians have been reportedly injured.

 - On 14 January 2024, seven IDPs sheltering in the same school in Khan Younis were injured as a result of a nearby home being struck. Four of the IDPs were transferred to the hospital. IDP tents were damaged from shrapnel and a smoke bomb also fell into the school.
 - On 15 January 2024, an UNRWA staff member was injured while he was inside the Sanitation
 Office in Khan Younis due to a strike near the office. He was transferred to the hospital, where he
 received the necessary treatment, and was later discharged. No damages were reported to the
 Sanitation Office.
- 235 incidents impacting UNRWA premises and the people inside them have been reported since the beginning of the war (some with multiple incidents impacting the same location), including at least 23 incidents of military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. 66 different UNRWA installations were directly hit, and 69 different installations sustained collateral damage.
- UNRWA estimates that in total at least 331 internally displaced people (IDPs) sheltering in UNRWA shelters have been killed and at least a further 1,157* injured since the start of the war. UNRWA is still

verifying the number of casualties caused by incidents that impacted its installations, and notes that these figures do not include some reported casualties where the number of injuries could not be determined.

1. Key points

- As of 17 January 2024, the total number of UNRWA colleagues killed since the beginning of hostilities is 151.
- According to OCHA, telecommunication services in Gaza remain shut down for a fifth consecutive day. Significant disruption of telecommunication services prevents people in Gaza from accessing lifesaving information or calling for first responders, and continues to impede humanitarian response.
- The Ministry of Health has announced that hepatitis A infection is spreading across informal camps due to overcrowding and lack of clean water and proper sanitation. UNRWA continues to monitor the situation, with suspected cases almost 16 times higher in January so far compared to the whole of November 2023. The massive increase reflects Gaza's worsening living conditions, particularly shortage of safe water and inadequate sanitation and hygiene. In shelters, there on average only 1.6L drinking water per person is delivered per day and toilets and showers are shared by hundreds and thousands of IDPs.
- As of 18 January, up to 1.7 million* people (over 75 per cent of the population**) have been displaced across the Gaza Strip, some multiple times***. Families are forced to move repeatedly in search of safety. Following intense Israeli bombardments and fighting in Khan Younis and the Middle Areas in recent days, a significant number of displaced people have moved again further south.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

On 16 and 17 January the following Israeli Security Forces (ISF) search and arrest operations occurred:

- Continuation of search and arrest operations in Tulkarm city, Tulkarm camp and Nur Shams refugee camp, northern West Bank. Early morning on 17 January in Tulkarm refugee camp, four Palestinians were killed and two were injured with live ammunition during an exchange of fire. At the northern entrance of the camp, infrastructure and property within the camp was damaged by exchanges of fire and use of ISF bulldozers. Five Palestinians were detained and one ISF soldier was reported injured during the clashes. In the late afternoon, ISF reportedly fired a missile towards Palestinian houses in the camp, resulting in property damage. One Palestinian woman was injured. ISF also detained five paramedics from the Palestinian Red Crescent Society.
- On the same day in the late evening ISF closed all entrances to the camp with earth mounds. Exchanges
 of fire were also reported in Tulkarm city and Nur Shams refugee camp. On the morning of 16 January,
 ISF reportedly rammed a Palestinian vehicle on Nablus Street in Tulkarm city, and then detained the
 four Palestinians who were inside following an interrogation. In the evening, ISF reportedly opened fire
 at another Palestinian vehicle in Izbat Al Jarad, killing one Palestinian and injuring two, including a child.
- Both Tulkarm and Nur Sams refugee camps have been undergoing heavy destruction and dozens of Palestinians have been arrested.
- UNRWA operations have been severally impacted and are currently suspended. Due to the security situation, the Palestinian Education Directorate suspended operations in the city switching all schools to e-learning.
- Overnight between 15 and 16 January, 14 Palestinians were detained in Idha, southern West Bank. On 16 January, ISF reportedly demolished several commercial structures and barracks, and confiscated Palestinian vehicles.
- Clashes between ISF and Palestinians were also reported during search and arrests operations in Nablus, Balata Camp and Askar Camp, northern West Bank. On 16 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Nablus, injuring one Palestinian and detaining another.
- Early morning on 17 January, ISF conducted search and arrest operations in Balata and Askar Camps, through these exchanges, ISF reportedly fired a rocket towards a vehicle near Balata Camp killing three Palestinians.
- On 16 January, ISF injured six Palestinians and detained 40 Palestinians workers originally from the Gaza Strip during a search and arrest operation in Qalqilya, northern West Bank.
- On 16 January, clashes between ISF and Palestinians were reported in Hussan, southern West Bank. ISF
 reportedly fired live ammunition in Al Martina area at the easter entrance of the city, and completely
 closed the area, as well as the center of the village, forcing Palestinians to close their shops.

2. Overall situation

 According to the Ministry of Health in Gaza as of 17 January, at least 24,448 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 61,504 Palestinians have been reportedly injured.

3. Humanitarian access & protection of civilians

- UNRWA is working to verify the details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further
 information will be provided once it becomes available.
 - On 16 January, a Health Centre in Gaza City was reportedly directly struck whereby at least two
 rooms were reportedly hit. Three IDPs sheltering at the health centre were reportedly killed and
 many others were injured. UNRWA is working to determine the number of IDPs inside the health
 centre at the time of the incident and the number of injuries.
 - On 16 January, due to a strike near a school in Khan Younis, shrapnel fell inside the school and
 caused an injury to a displaced man who received treatment at the medical point inside the
 school. Thousands of IDPs were sheltering in the school at the time.
 - On 17 January, a school in Khan Younis was reportedly used by ISF for military operations, including for dropping supplies for the military. Damages to the school building were reported in a number of locations, including severe damage to walls.

UNRWA Shelters

- On 11 January, UNRWA continued to provide health care at UNRWA health centres and shelters with 690 staff maintaining health services.
- On 11 January, UNRWA attended to 20,952 patients in UNRWA shelters and health centres.
- Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) services continued in the Middle Areas and Khan Younis (south) with a team of two psychiatrists and 20 counsellors and supervisors to assist special cases referred from health centres and shelters. On 11 January, the team responded to 1,962 cases through individual consultations, awareness sessions and support for gender-based violence cases.
- UNRWA received vaccines from UNICEF for its health centres. Eight different types of vaccines were
 received (refrigerated and freezer storage). This allowed for vaccinations to restart. On 11 January, a
 total of 768 children were vaccinated against diseases such as measles, mumps and rubella, and others.

Psychosocial support (PSS)

- On January 16, UNRWA teams continue to provide psychosocial first aid and other specialized protection services to IDPs.
- 283 school counsellors and assistant counsellors conducted 995 individual and family consultations in Rafah and Khan Younis (south), alongside 722 group sessions. 13,407 IDPs were reached, with the cumulative total of 74,187 PSS sessions since 7 October.
- During the same period, school counsellors provided psychological support to nearly 275 UNRWA staff, through in-person and remote consultations. The total number of UNRWA staff who have received psychological support since the beginning of the hostilities is 8,589.

Food security

• UNRWA continued to **distribute flour** outside of shelters in the southern governorates. **A total of 309.779 families have been reached so far.**

Water and Sanitation Services (WASH)

Due to the security situation in combination with internet connectivity we are unable to update our results for WASH.

- On 16 January, water wells in Jabalia (north), Khan Younis and Rafah (south) were operational. Nearly 3,000 cubic metres have been pumped. Khan Younis and Rafah water wells have operated in two shifts (12 hours) to provide potable/domestic water supply services.
 - Provision of potable water through tankers at Rafah and Middle area ensured availability of water in shelters, with some interruption in the Middle Area due to evacuation orders. Khan Younis shelters are provided with water through UNRWA water wells.
 - Solid waste management services continued in Rafah, Khan Younis and Middle Area camps (partially). The service is suspended in Bureij camp due to the military operations. About 45 loadings were transferred to temporary dumping sites.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

West Bank updates cover 18 – 21 January 2024.

Between 18 – 21 January the following Israeli Security Forces (ISF) search and arrest operations occurred:

- Search and arrest operations in Tulkarm city, Tulkarm refugee camp and Nur Shams refugee camp, northern West Bank concluded on the morning of 19 January, after 45 hours. The operations resulted in multiple fatalities, injuries and arrests, as well as unprecedented damage to both refugee camps, including houses and streets.
 - 1. On 18 January, exchanges of fire between Palestinians and ISF continued in Tulkarm refugee camp, nine Palestinians were reported injured, eight from physical assault and one from live ammunition. ISF reportedly prevented Palestinian Red Crescent Services' ambulances from transferring injured Palestinians and a woman who was giving birth, to the hospital. In the afternoon, ISF reportedly detonated several Palestinian houses and installations with explosives and set a house on fire. Also, ISF reportedly continued destroying property and infrastructure in the camp, physically assaulting people and detaining Palestinians. Two Palestinian children were killed and three Palestinians injured. In Nur Shams camp, ISF reportedly continued bulldozing and destroying camp infrastructure. One house was demolished, one Palestinian killed and one child injured.
- Overnight on 18 January, four Palestinians were detained in a search and arrest operation in Nablus, northern West Bank.
- Overnight on 18 January, six Palestinians were injured with live ammunition when ISF reportedly opened fire at Palestinians during a search and arrest operation in Al Am'ari camp, central West Bank.

- Early in the morning on 18 January, ISF conducted multiple search and arrest operations in different locations in southern West Bank. Twelve Palestinians were detained in Aroub refugee camp and eighteen Palestinians were detained in Harmala, southern West Bank.
- On 19 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Qalqiliya city, northern West Bank. ISF reportedly opened fired during clashes with Palestinians near the southern entrance of the city, injuring one Palestinian with live ammunition. Another exchange of fire between Palestinians and ISF was reported at the northern entrance of the city. On 22 January, ISF detained two Palestinians and reportedly assaulted and injured a Palestinian elder in his home during a search and arrest operation.
- Early in the morning on 21 January in Al Khalil, southern West Bank ISF conducted punitive demolition of the houses of the two Palestinians who were killed in the security incidents at the Tunnels checkpoint on 16 November 2023. Clashes started during the demolition, and ISF reportedly opened fire at Palestinians, injuring one with live ammunition.
- On 22 January, ISF opened fired in clashes during a search and arrest operation in Al Bireh, central West Bank. One Palestinian was injured in the head with a live ammunition shrapnel and three Palestinians were detained.
- On 22 January, ISF opened fired in clashes during a search and arrest operation in Yatta, southern West Bank. Two Palestinians, including one minor, were injured with a live ammunition.
- On 22 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Izbat At Tayyah village, east of Tulkarm city, northern West Bank. UNRWA operations were severally impacted.

• UNRWA is working to verify the details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further information will be provided once it becomes available.

- On 8 January, classrooms of a school in Maghazi camp, in the Middle area, were directly struck and severely damaged. An unconfirmed number of people were killed inside the school and were subsequently buried in the schoolyard alongside other people killed outside the school in the same incident.
- On 13 January, due to kinetic strikes near a distribution centre and am Relief and Social Services Office in Nuseirat camp, in the Middle area, some shrapnel fell on the roof of the guard rooms causing damage to the buildings. No injuries were reported.
- On 13 January, stray bullets and many pieces of shrapnel fell inside a school in Khan Younis. No damage or injuries were reported. Thousands of IDPs were sheltering in the school at the time of the incident.
- On 15 January, the ISF surrounded an area in Gaza City where a school was sheltering IDPs; heavy shelling caused shrapnel to fall in the school, injuring three IDPs inside. The ISF entered the school using tanks, bulldozers and infantry troops. ISF bulldozers destroyed the perimeter walls. The ISF ordered the IDPs to evacuate the classrooms and separated the men from the women and children. The men were made to strip to their underwear and go through screening and interrogation with their hands tied, whilst the women and children were searched by female ISF soldiers. The ISF forced the evacuation of 700 IDPs including older persons, pregnant women, the sick and the injured. Subsequently, the IDPs moved towards the South of Wadi Gaza through the coastal road.
- On 22 January 2024, six IDPs were killed and 16 were injured because of stray bullets and shrapnel falling in the adjacent area outside the Khan Younis Training Centre (KYTC), where many IDPs had set up their tents. The bodies of the killed persons and the injured were brought inside the KYTC. The bodies were later evacuated by PRCS. All the injured were treated at the medical point inside the KYTC.
- On 22 January 2024, a store in Khan Younis was completely burnt due to shelling. No deaths or injuries were reported.

1. Key points

The Gaza Strip

- Intense fighting in/around Khan Younis (Southwest of Gaza) over the last three days is causing loss of lives and damage to civilian infrastructure, including UNRWA's largest shelter in the southern area, the Khan Younis Training Centre.
- On 24 January, the UNRWA Khan Younis Training Centre was hit by direct fire. It struck a building housing 800 displaced people. At least 13 people were killed and 56 injured, 21 of them critically, in what should have been a place of safety. 43,000 internally displaced people are registered in and within close vicinity of the training centre, which is being used as an UNRWA shelter. Yesterday's strike was the third direct hit on this compound. UNRWA shares the location of all its facilities including shelters directly with Israeli authorities. UNRWA received assurances that people inside them would be safe.
- As of 22 January 2024, the total number of UNRWA colleagues killed since the beginning of hostilities has increased by one and is now 152.

- According to OCHA, telecommunication services in Gaza have been gradually restored in most of the Strip, while the internet remains severely disrupted in all areas. This prevents people in Gaza from accessing life-saving information and continues to impede humanitarian response. Due to the security situation and poor internet connectivity, we are unable to update the number of people reached since Sitrep 67.
- As of 22 January, up to 1.7 million* people (over 75 per cent of the population)** have been displaced across the Gaza Strip, some multiple times.*** Families are forced to move repeatedly in search of safety. Following intense Israeli bombardments and fighting in Khan Younis and the Middle Areas in recent days, a significant number of displaced people have moved again further south.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

West Bank updates cover 23 – 24 January 2024.

Between 23–24 January the following Israeli Security Forces (ISF) search and arrest operations occurred:

- Overnight on 22 23 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Beit Furik, northern West Bank. ISF reportedly opened fired during the clashes injuring one Palestinian.
- On 23 January near Enab checkpoint, southeast of Tulkarm, northern West Bank, ISF shot dead a Palestinian from Far'un village. Following the incident, ISF closed the checkpoint.
- On 23 January at night, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Ya'bad, northern West Bank. ISF reportedly opened fire during the clashes injuring one Palestinian with live ammunition.
- On 23 January at night, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Nablus, northern
 West Bank. ISF reportedly opened fire during the clashes injuring two Palestinians, including
 a minor, with live ammunition. Palestinian Red Cresent Society ambulances were reportedly
 prevented from reaching the injured by ISF.

- On 23 January at night, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Sabastiya, northern West Bank. ISF reportedly opened fire during the clashes and destroyed several Palestinian vehicles.
- On the morning of 23 January, a Palestinian woman allegedly attempted to stab ISF soldiers. ISF shot her near the Psagot settlement, injuring her. She was then detained.
- On 24 January, ISF reportedly shot at a Palestinian in Al Jalama, northern West Bank, resulting in shrapnel injuries.
- On 24 January, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Beita, northern central West Bank, injuring one Palestinian.
- On 24January 24, ISF conducted a search and arrest operation in Adh Dhahiriya, southern central West Bank. ISF reportedly used live ammunition and tear gas canisters during clashes, injuring a Palestinian with live ammunition. ISF reportedly confiscated five Palestinian vehicles.

2. Overall situation

The Gaza Strip

 According to the Ministry of Health in Gaza as of 24 January, at least 25,700 Palestinians have been killed in the Gaza Strip since 7 October. About 70 per cent of those killed are reported to be women and children. Another 63,740 Palestinians have been reportedly injured.

The West Bank, including East Jerusalem

- According to OCHA, between 7 October 2023 22 January 2024, 360 Palestinians, including 92 children, have been killed in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem.
- Last year (2023), was the deadliest year for Palestinians in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem since the UN began recording casualties in 2005.

3. Humanitarian access & protection of civilians

The Gaza Strip

Please see incidents for the period 23-24 January 2024 below:

- UNRWA is working to verify the details of incidents reportedly affecting UNRWA premises. Further information will be provided once it becomes available.
 - On 23 January, two IDPs were killed by gunshot and eight IDPs were injured inside the Khan Younis Training Centre, of whom six were injured by gunshots and two by shrapnel resulting from strikes on a nearby location.
 - On 24 January, a school in Khan Younis was directly struck by artillery shelling and gunfire, resulting in eight IDPs being injured. Thousands of IDPs were sheltering at the school at the time of the incident.
 - On 24 January, stray bullets and pieces of shrapnel fell inside the Khan Younis Training Centre. As a result, one IDP was killed and three were injured.

- Later on the same day, the carpentry workshop at the Khan Younis Training Centre was
 hit from the northern side by three tank shells and gunshots. As a result, a fire broke out
 inside the carpentry workshop. 13 IDPs were killed and at least 56 were injured. Civil
 Defense arrived at the site and put the fire out. Nearly 43,000 IDPs were sheltering in and
 around the Training Centre at the time of the incident.
- 253* incidents impacting UNRWA premises and the people inside them have been reported since the beginning of the war (some with multiple incidents impacting the same location), including at least 25 incidents of military use and/or interference at UNRWA premises. 70 different UNRWA installations were directly hit, and 71 different installations sustained collateral damage.
- UNRWA estimates that in total at least 357* internally displaced people (IDPs) sheltering in UNRWA shelters have been killed and at least a further 1,255* injured since the start of the war. UNRWA is still verifying the number of casualties caused by incidents that impacted its installations, and notes that these figures do not include some reported casualties where the number of injuries could not be determined.

4. UNRWA response

The Gaza Strip

Due to the security situation in combination with internet connectivity we are unable to provide any additional updates since sitrep 67.

 As of 24 January, in total, nearly 1.7 million displaced people are now sheltering across emergency shelters (UNRWA and public shelters), informal sites or in close vicinity to UNRWA shelters and distribution sites and within host communities.

Due to the security situation and ISF evacuation orders between 150-155 UNRWA installations continue to shelter IDPs. Shelters are very congested.

Health

Due to the security situation in combination with internet connectivity we are only able to provide partial health updates.

On 22 January, only four (out of 22) UNRWA health centres were operational. This follows the closure of two health centres in Khan Younis following ISF military operations.

UNRWA received vaccines from UNICEF for its health centres. **Eleven** different types of vaccines were received (refrigerated and freezer storage). This allowed for vaccinations to restart. Since 3 January up to 24 January, over **13,700** children were vaccinated against diseases such as measles, mumps and rubella, and others.

Hepatitis A infection is spreading across informal camps due to overcrowding and lack of clean water and proper sanitation. UNRWA continues to monitor the situation, with suspected cases almost 16 times higher in January so far compared to the whole of November 2023. The massive

increase reflects Gaza's worsening living conditions, particularly shortage of safe water and inadequate sanitation and hygiene.

 - On 26 January 2024, shrapnel fell inside a school in Khan Younis, resulting in one man sheltering
 in the school being seriously injured. The injured man was transferred to Nasser Hospital.
