



Verification of Rohingya Family Book (alien ID:

In response to your letter dated 21 May 2013 addressed to UNHCR Representation Office in Bangladesh regarding the verification/information of Mr. registered under your reference ID: please see our feedback below:



4. General Information on the Family Book: Kindly note that the family book alone cannot be a credible indicator to determine the claim for international protection of a Rohingya applicant. The majority of family book were issued in 1992-1994 and the standards of the family book vary considerably. Family books are not tied to a database, they are handwritten (sometimes illegibly), and have suffered from wear-and-tear over the years. For example, in some books the particulars have faded and the authorities simply overwrote the particular by hand. As such, there could be mistakes in the spelling or even in the names (some are corrected simply by striking out the line).

Family books can be genuine, but the holder may not be the original owner of the book. On the other hand, the person might be genuine but the family book might not be his own. On this particular case, there can be one of the few possibilities:

a. That he is the real who submitted the genuine family book;

b. That is another Rohingya from Myanmar pretending to be the genuine/ modified family book; or and procured

c. That he is a Bangladeshi pretending to be genuine/modified family book. and procured the

If a. or b., then the IC may still very well be in need of international protection, regardless of having procured the family book by irregular means.
