## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 361,000 last week to 368,400 this week.

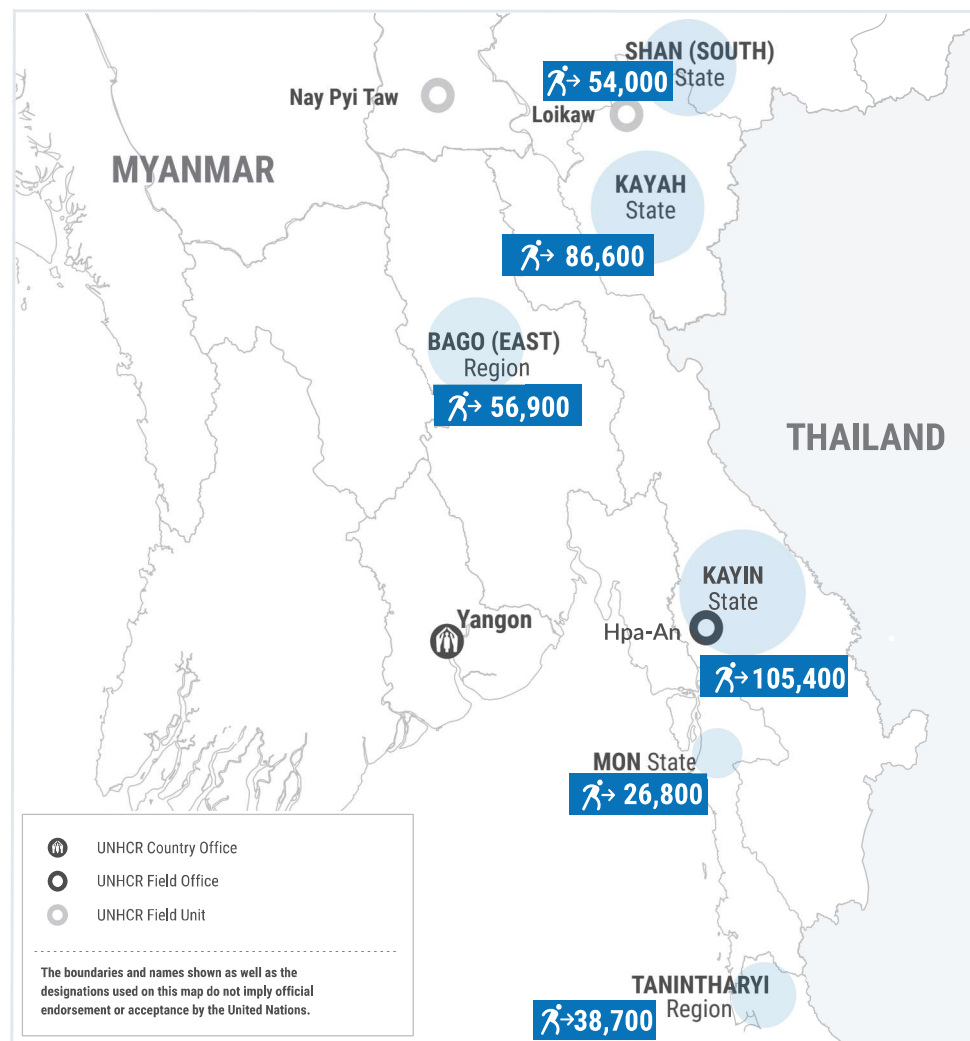
In Kayin State, indiscriminate shelling, use of heavy weapons and shootings displaced 6,200 people in Thandaunggyi Township. Of this figure, 4,200 were displaced within the township while 2000 sought safety in Bago (East) Taungoo Township.

In Kayah State, fighting on 23 and 24 January displaced 1,000 people within Demoso and Loikaw Townships. Among them were 500 IDPs who were displaced yet again. In Shan State (South), approximately 500 people from Hsihseng Township were displaced within the township.

In Tanintharyi Region, ongoing conflict in Palaw Township displaced about 630 people within the township.

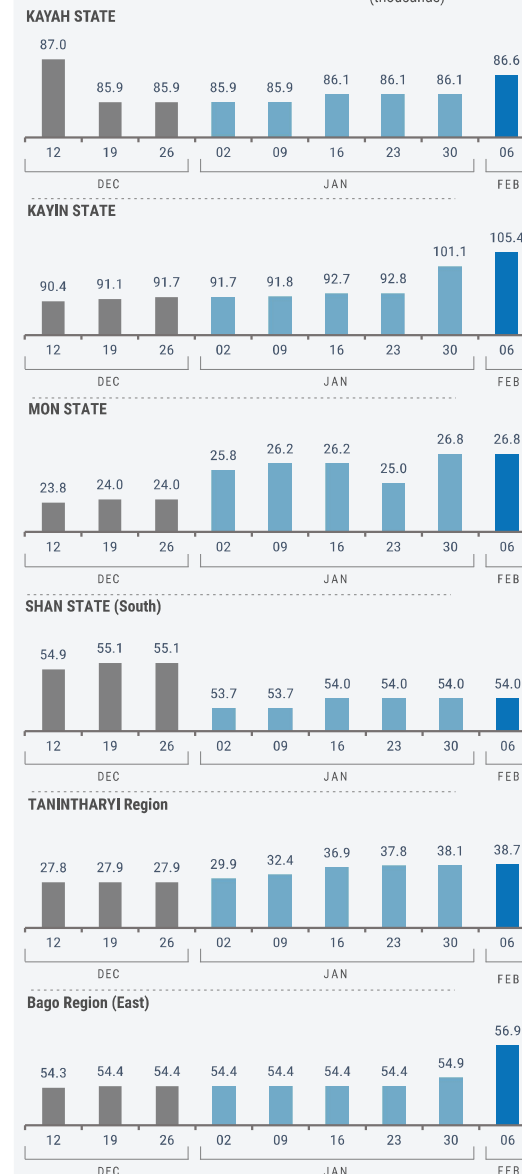
