Documented incidents

Between 11-17 December 2023: In Wad Madani city, Al Jazirah state, ICRC pulled out its staff as fighting reached the area. **Source: New Age**

- **14 December 2023:** In the Abgota area, Al Jazirah state, the RSF entered a hospital during an armed incursion in the area where they closed access roads, looted the market and the agricultural bank. **Source: Sudan War Updates**
- **18 December 2023:** In Rufaa city, Al Jazirah State, the RSF raided a hospital, killing two health workers. A market was also looted. **Source: Personal Communication**
- **18 December 2023:** In Rufaa city, Al Jazirah state, a hospital, the army headquarters and a police office were taken over by the RSF. **Source:** <u>The New Arab</u>
- **18 December 2023:** In Tambul, Al Jazirah state, a doctor's house and clinic were looted by the RSF. **Source: Personal Communication**
- **19 December 2023:** In Wad Madani, Al Jazirah state, an ambulance for children with cancer was looted by the RSF from the Rest House Joanna Amal 2. **Source: Personal Communication**
- **19 December 2023:** In Wad Madani, Al Jazirah state, a MSF compound was attacked by armed men. Two cars and other items were looted. MSF was forced to suspend its services in the area due to security deterioration. **Source:** <u>MSF</u>
- 21 December 2023: In Wad Madani, Al Jazirah state, all health facilities are out of service. Source: Sudan Medical Syndicate
- **24 December 2023:** In Sifeiya, Al Jazirah state, the Kenana Sugar Company (KSC) Hospital is out of service due to SAF bombing in the area. **Source:** Personal Communication
- **24 December 2023:** In Al Jazirah state, a doctor's wife, his brother's wife, the mother of his nephew's wife and his six-year-old daughter were killed when a car overturned them on the road and attacked them as they were fleeing Wad Madani. **Source: Sudan Violations**
