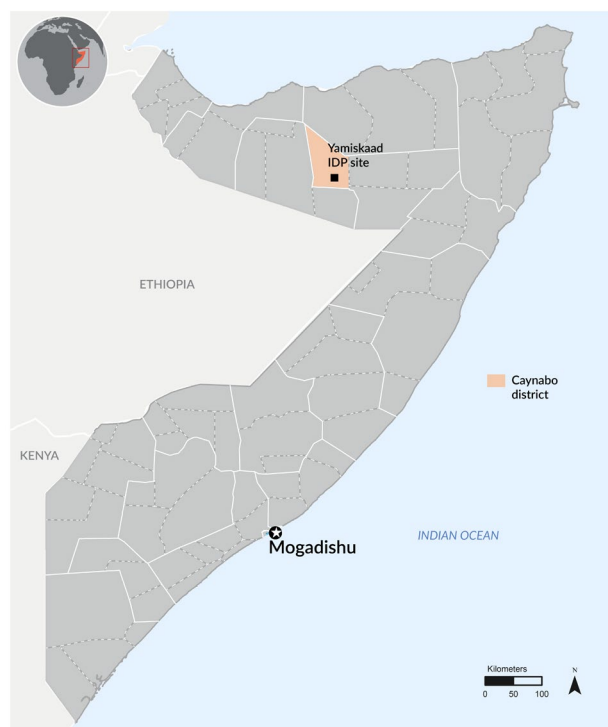

### Background

In Caynabo district, Sool region, recent heavy rainfall accompanied by strong winds severely impacted displaced communities residing in Yamiskaad IDP site. The storm caused significant damage, destroying approximately 200 temporary shelters and the solar lighting system, community latrines, and partially destroying the site's only one-room school, which lost its roof due to the force of the winds.

As a result, an estimated 310 households, comprising approximately 1,860 individuals, have been displaced. These affected individuals, including children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities, are currently residing in open spaces in the outskirts of the site without proper shelter or protection.

To date, no humanitarian assistance has reached the affected population. The community is in urgent need of emergency support, particularly temporary shelter, non-food items, and protection services.

### Protection Risks

**Destruction of personal property:** A vast majority, approximately 75% of the temporary household shelters at the IDP site, were destroyed. This has extremely increased the vulnerability of the residents, who are now exposed to harsh weather and protection risks.

**Psychological and emotional distress:** The loss of homes, latrines, community centers, and basic facilities has caused significant emotional distress and trauma among the IDP population. This situation further increased their vulnerability, particularly for groups who are already at-risk.

## Urgent Needs

**Emergency shelter and NFIs:** The recent rains accompanied by strong winds destroyed the majority of temporary shelters in Yamiskaad IDP site. As a result, emergency shelter support including tents, plastic sheets and household kits are urgently required to protect displaced households from exposure to harsh weather conditions and restore a basic sense of safety and dignity.

**WASH:** The storm severely damaged the site's limited number of community latrines, many of which were already insufficient for the population. Currently, all existing latrines are either damaged or completely destroyed, leaving the community without access to safe sanitation facilities. There is an urgent need for the restoration and construction of emergency latrines to prevent public health risks and avert an outbreak of cholera and Acute Watery Diarrhoea (AWD).

**Protection services:** Provision of psychosocial counselling and protection services to the affected community, identification and providing targeted support for persons with specific needs including those with disabilities and the elderly.

The Protection and Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN) is a UNHCR-led project that identifies and reports on displacements, as well as the protection risks and incidents driving such population movements. On behalf of UNHCR and the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), 10 local partners across Somalia conduct data gathering—primarily through interviews with affected communities and key informants—and monitor displacement trends at strategic locations.
