
In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 1,025,400 last week to 1,039,500 this week.


In Tanintharyi Region, 1,192 people from Maung Mei Shaung village in Dawei Township, 8,045 people from Thein Khun in Tanintharyi Township, and 294 people from Pein Taw in Thayetchaung Township were displaced within the same townships due to MAF troop reinforcements.

In Kayin State, 2,757 people from Mee Zaing area in Hpa-An Township were displaced to Myaing Gyi Ngu due to airstrikes, indiscriminate shelling by the MAF, and the potential for further clashes.

In Bago East, 1,000 people from Shin Le Pyin in Thandaunggyi Township were displaced to Moe Kaung, Taungoo Township, due to intensified fighting.

In Bago West, 215 people from Bagan Kwe in Padaung Township and 405 people from Rakhine State were displaced to Pyay and Shwedaung Townships due to escalating violence.




