Treatment of individuals affiliated with or perceived to be affiliated with the Mujahedeen-e-Khalq (MEK) by the government

1. Information on the Mujahedeen-e-Khalq (MEK)

The People's Mujahedin of Iran (PMOI,¹ also called: Mujahedeen-e Khalq or MEK/MKO) is a political dissident group² operating outside Iran.³ The MEK is affiliated with the National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI), an organization considered the 'political wing' of the MEK,⁴ which presents itself as an alternative Iranian 'parliament in exile'.⁵ Both the NCRI and the MEK are led by Maryam Rajavi.⁶ Further, the organizations call for regime change in Iran.⁷ According to Reuters, in June 2025, Rajavi stated that the groups sought a 'democratic, non-nuclear republic, with the separation of religion and state, gender equality and also autonomy for Iran's nationalities'.⁸

The MEK began as a leftist revolutionary group opposing the Shah of Iran in the years leading up to the 1979 Islamic Revolution.⁹ After falling out with the new regime, the group launched an armed rebellion against the Islamic Republic, conducting attacks on Iran during the Iran-Iraq War, before relocating to Albania in the mid-2010s due to pressure from Iraqi authorities.¹⁰ Many MEK members are based in Albania,¹¹ whilst the NCRI is based in Paris, France.¹² According to sources, 3 000 Iranian exiled dissidents from the MEK¹³ were based in Ashraf-3 camp, 30 kilometers west of Albania's capital, Tirana.¹⁴

Iranian authorities consider the MEK a terrorist organization¹⁵ and it was listed as a terrorist organization by the European Union and the United States until 2012,¹⁶ after it agreed to ‘abandon violent operations’.¹⁷ However, sources further described that the MEK does not have a significant influence in Iran and amongst Iranians.¹⁸

2. Treatment by the government

Iranian authorities claimed that the MEK were responsible for 17 000 deaths in Iran,¹⁹ over the past four decades, ‘a figure that is regularly repeated by Iran's state-controlled media’.²⁰ Moreover, the Iranian authorities accuse MEK members of various incidents in Iran,²¹ including cooperating with Israel in the 12-day Iran-Israel conflict²² in June 2025.²³ The 2023 Country Report on Iran by Netherlands’ Ministry of Foreign Affairs, citing external sources, described that ‘the authorities reported several arrests of individuals and the winding up of networks allegedly linked to the People’s Mujahedin’.²⁴

Some examples documented by sources of Iranians being targeted for involvement or perceived involvement with the MEK group are:

- In August 2025, Iranian authorities arrested three individuals ‘linked’ to the MEK, accusing them of forming ‘sabotage cells’ to disrupt public order. The arrests, made by the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps near Tehran, came amid allegations that MEK were using ‘underground propaganda’ to recruit members and incite unrest.²⁵

- In July 2025, Iranian authorities executed two members of the MEK group, Mehdi Hassani and Behrouz Ehsani-Eslamloo, for allegedly attacking civilian infrastructure with homemade projectiles.²⁶ They were sentenced to death in September 2024, and indicted with ‘Moharebeh - an Islamic term meaning waging war against God, destroying public property and membership in a terrorist organisation with the aim of disrupting national security’.²⁷ According to Amnesty International, the two men ‘repeatedly denied these accusations, saying they were based on forced “confessions” extracted through torture and other ill-treatment’.²⁸
- In January 2025, Amnesty International reported that six men convicted of membership in the MEK were sentenced to death by the Revolutionary Court of Tehran, ‘following a grossly unfair trial’ in October 2024, which was ‘marred by allegations of torture’ used to ‘extract forced “confessions”’.²⁹
- In December 2024, Iranian authorities arrested four MEK operatives, accusing them of engaging in ‘acts of sabotage and espionage’. The individuals were transferred to the judiciary to face charges related to their alleged criminal activities.³⁰
- In December 2023, Marzieh Farsi and Forough Taghipour were each sentenced to 15 years in prison for allegedly collaborating with the MEK, having both been previously arrested on similar charges. The court proceeded in their absence after they refused to attend or recognize the legitimacy of the proceedings.³¹
- In April 2023, an Iranian criminal court sentenced Majid Khademi to ten years in prison on charges of ‘assembly and collusion against national security,’ ‘propaganda against the regime’, and ‘membership in anti-regime groups’, reportedly the MEK.³²
- Sources from 2024 and 2025 report that Iran’s criminal courts have prosecuted 104 MEK members residing in Albania, formally bringing charges against them.³³
- An April 2023 article by Iran Wire quoted political activist and daughter of a former Iranian president, Faezeh Hashemi, saying that MEK members ‘are in prison because members of their families were Mojahed, meaning that they themselves have done nothing but have been given heavy sentences’.³⁴
- A January 2023 article reported that Maryam Akbari Monfared has been imprisoned in Iran since 2009 for allegedly supporting the MEK and has endured torture during her detention.³⁵
