WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 1,033,300 last week to 1,041,000 this week.

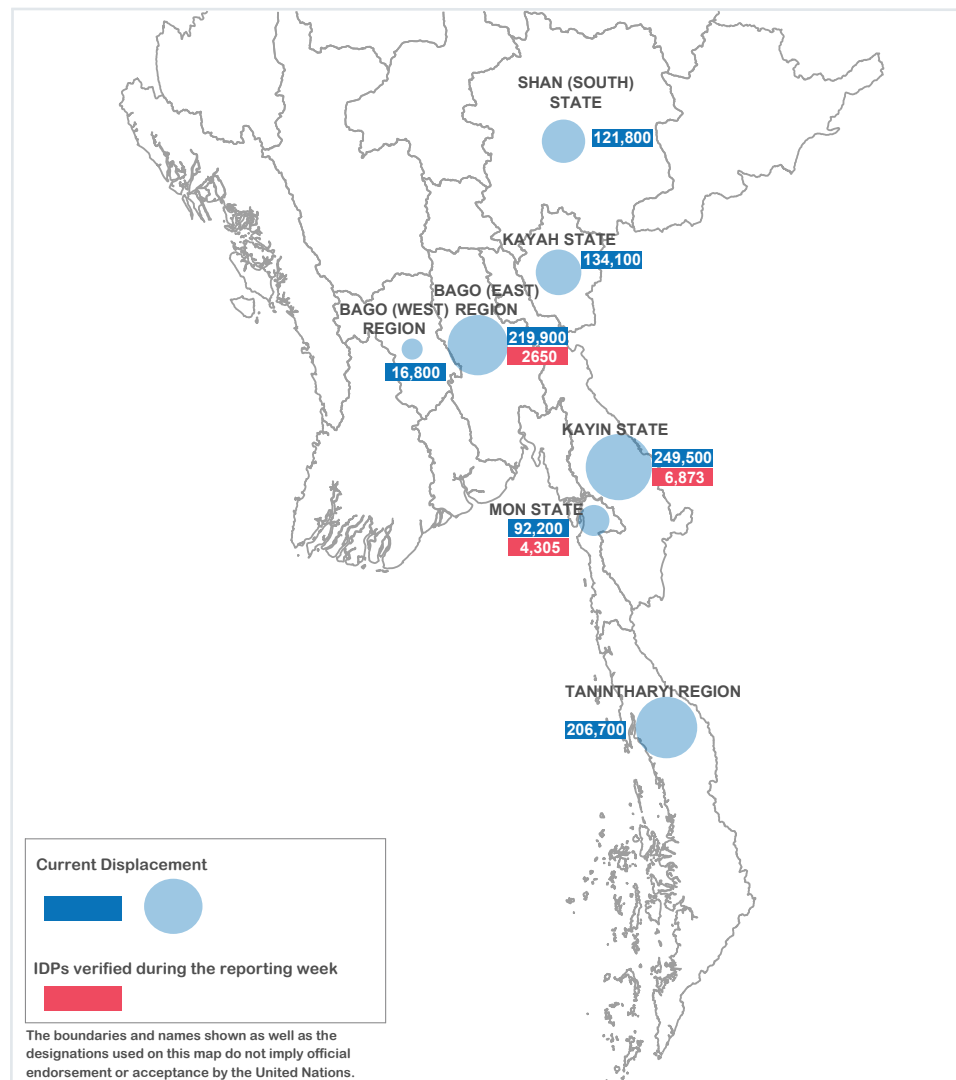
In Bago East, 2,650 people from Oke Shit Pin, Taungoo Township were displaced to Taungoo Town due to armed clashes.

In Kayin State, escalating violence including airstrikes and indiscriminate shelling in the Kyondoe area resulted in the displacement of 6,873 people from Kawkareik Township—973 of whom fled to Hpa-An Township, while 5,900 were displaced within their township.

In Mon State, 80 people from Taung Kyar Inn, Kawkareik Township were forced to flee to Kyaikmaraw Township due to conflict, while an additional 4,225 people from the same township were displaced to Mawlamyine Township.

In Shan South, returns were reported as security conditions improved: 2,488 IDPs from Taunggyi Township returned to their places of origin in Loikaw and Hsihseng Townships; 2,132 IDPs from Pinlaung Township returned to Pekon and areas within Pinlaung; 802 IDPs from Nyaungshwe Township and 595 from Hopong Township returned to their places of origin in Loikaw and Hsihseng.

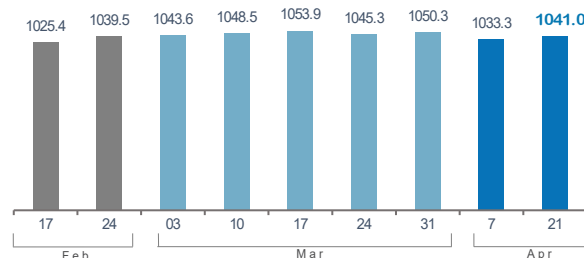
